ENSEMBLE BIOS:

ANDREA ASSAF is a poet/playwright, director, performer, and cultural organizer. She is the founding Artistic and Executive Director of Art2Action Inc., and Co-Director of the National Institute for Directing & Ensemble Creation in partnership with Pangea World Theater. Her seminal work, Eleven Reflections on September, was commissioned by Pangea and has been featured at The Carver Community Cultural Center, the National Asian American Theatre Festival at OSF (produced

by CAATA), La MaMa, The Apollo Theatre, The Kennedy Center, and internationally. Other plays include: *Outside the Circle* (co-written with Samuel Valdez), *Fronteras Desviadas/Deviant Borders* (with Mujeres en Ritual), and most recently, *DRONE*. Awards include: 2021 Silk Road Film Awards Cannes (Director, Best Experimental Feature), 2020 Pushcart Prize Nomination, 2019 NEFA National Theatre Project, 2019 & 2011 NPN Creation Fund Commissions, 2017 Finalist for the Freedom Plow Award for Poetry & Activism, 2010 Princess Grace Award/Gant Gaither Theater Award for Directing, and more. Andrea has a master's degree in Performance Studies and a BFA in Acting, both from NYU. She currently serves on the Board of the Consortium of Asian American Theatres & Artists (CAATA), Alternate ROOTS, and is a founding Steering Committee member of the Middle Eastern/North African Theatre-Makers Alliance (MENATMA).



LUBANA AL QUNTAR was born in Damascus, Syria, and trained in classical international conservatories under the supervision of world-renowned opera singers such as Galina Khaldieva, Kenneth Woollam, and Maestra Mya Besselink. She has been awarded such prestigious titles as the First Arab Opera Singer from Syria, and fifth prize at the The Queen Elizabeth Singing Competition in Brussels, Belgium. Lubana has toured throughout Europe, the Middle East, North Africa, and

North America and served as the Voice Chair for the Department of Opera Singing at the Syrian National Conservatory.



AIDA SHAHGHASEMI is an independent Minneapolis-based musician with roots in Iran. She has been a touring member of Iron and Wine and Marketa Irglova's band while also being a recording artist on two of Glen Hansard's albums. Her three albums are "Wind Between the Horse's Ears," released in 2015, "Cypress of Abarkooh," released in 2019 and "Chashmandaaze Rooydaad," released in August of 2022. She is a McKnight Music Fellow.



ZAFER TAWIL is a Palestinian musician and a virtuoso on 'oud, qanun, violin, and Arab percussion. He performs across the U.S. and in the Middle East exploring the boundaries of Arab music, often in collaborative concerts involving classical Indian and Persian music, as well as Jazz fusion. He was a featured composer and performer in Jonathan Demme's Oscar-nominated film *Rachel Getting Married* and teaches workshops on Arab music at institutions across the U.S.



ASHLEY WILKERSON is an award-winning Actress, Poet and Wellness Practitioner. She received her B.A. in Cultural Studies & Media from Eugene Lang College -The New School, and is a proud graduate of Arts Magnet. Films include: *The Bond, Hunter Gatherer*, etc. Select theater credits include: *The Mountaintop* (Jubilee Theater), *Speed Killed My Cousin* (Carpetbag Theatre), *Freckle In My Eye* (South Dallas Cultural Center), & *The Wake of Jamey Foster* (Cherry Lane Theatre).



ANU YADAV is a critically-acclaimed actress, playwright, and cultural worker. She was 2019-2020 Creative Strategist Artist-in-Residence with the Los Angeles County Government Department of Mental Health. She is a member of the Actor's Equity Association, the Center for Performance and Civic Practice, and the Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival. She is a graduate of Bryn Mawr College and holds an M.F.A. in Performance from University of Maryland, College Park.
